ENTRY FEES

First entry is \$20 for the first run then \$12 for all additional runs per dog/per day. Please make checks payable to CBDTC (Columbia Basin Dog Training Club). Entry fees include AKC recording fee of \$3.50 first entry and \$3.00 additional Entry. Catalogs may be pre-ordered for \$10 on the entry form. A limited number will be available at the trial.

ONLINE ENTRIES

Online entries are available for these trials through the online entry service provided by R2Agility. Go to www.r2agilityonline.com to set up an account and follow instructions there. During the first 48 hours after opening the initial limit of entries per day designated as either online or paper will be as follows: For each trial, 100 runs/trial via online entries, 230 runs/trial via paper entries. If either form of entry has not filled at the end of the 48 hour time period, the Club reserves the right to decrease or increase either one accordingly.



DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months or age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Services (FSS) breeds. Bitches in season are not allowed on the show grounds.

Important Information for Exhibitors -- PLEASE READ!

Conditional, unsigned, incomplete, illegible, telephone, fax, e-mail or telegraph entries cannot be accepted. Entries not on official AKC forms, or photocopies of AKC forms without the agreement and rules on the reverse side of the official AKC entry form, are not acceptable. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry.

A complete set of rules for all classes is available from the American Kennel Club, 8051 Arco Corporate Drive, Suite 100, Raleigh, NC 27617-3390, or from the AKC web site. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to enter their dog in the correct class. The Trial Secretary cannot make any changes (except for move-ups as a result of completing a title, and correction of specific errors as provided in the Regulations for Agility Trials, Chapter 1, Section 21) after the closing date of the trial. Be sure to check your entry form carefully and make certain you have entered the correct class(es). <u>Contact the Trial Secretary if you have questions!</u>

Entries sent by express mailing services MUST have the delivery signature requirement waived; otherwise receipt may be delayed. Entries will not be considered as being received until they are delivered to the address given on the entry form. Please note the opening date of July 6, 2016; no entries will be accepted before that date. Entries for a maximum of ten (10) dogs are allowed in one envelope; envelopes containing entries for more than ten dogs will be considered invalid, and will be returned to the sender. No hand delivered entries can be accepted until 8:00 a.m. on July 9, 2016

WAIT LIST

CBDTC is using a wait list to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date/time. A maximum of 25 entries (runs) will be placed on each trial's wait list. All entries must have been <u>received</u> by the Trial Secretary prior to Friday, August 26, 2016 at 11:00 p.m. Any entries withdrawn, with notification to the Trial Secretary in writing (e-mail OK) by 6:00 p.m. on Monday, August 29, 2016 will be replaced by a wait listed entry, if any are available. If a withdrawn entry is replaced by a wait listed entry, a full refund will be issued for the withdrawn entry; otherwise no refund will be given for withdrawn entries, except as specified above. Any wait listed entry that does not get into the trial will receive a full refund.

REFUNDS

Entry fees will not be refunded in the event of errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date, or in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by the Show Committee. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

Bitches in season are not permitted to compete in agility trials. As such, the club will refund the full amount if the trial secretary has confirmed receipt of information on or before the close of the trial. After closing, refunds less \$3.50 in fees per class/per day will be given for bitches in season, if written email notification is received by the TRIAL SECRETARY prior to the start of the trial. Verification from a veterinarian may be required at the clubs discretions.

CONFIRMATION AND JUDGING SCHEDULE

Confirmation of entry and judging schedule will be e-mailed (or sent by postal mail to the address on the official AKC entry form, if no e-mail is provided) after the closing date; if not received at least 7 days prior to the show, contact the Trial Secretary. Acknowledgment of receipt of entries prior to closing will be provided if the exhibitor provides a valid e-mail address on the entry form, or includes a stamped, self-addressed postcard with entry.

LIABILITY

Club members will be present at the trial site overnight. However, Columbia Basin Dog Training Club assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or spectators or to any of their dogs or property, and further assumes no responsibility for injury to any child not under the control of his/her parents or guardians. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Show Committee, be asked to leave the show site and no refund of any fees paid will be made. All dogs must be on leash at all times except when in the ring or designated warm-up area.

THIS CLUB DOES NOT AGREE TO ARBITRATE CLAIMS AS SET FORTH ON THE OFFICIAL AKC ENTRY FORM FOR THIS EVENT.

HEIGHT DIVISIONS

In the Regular classes, handlers may choose to run in a higher height division, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. In the Preferred classes, dogs may NOT run in a higher height division than that determined by their withers height.

The entry form has a box at the top of the form to check if the dog needs to be measured. Please check this box if appropriate, so that the Trial Secretary knows to include your dog on the "Dogs to be Measured List". It is no longer required that you submit a copy of your dogs jump height card with your entry form or show it during day of show check-in, but it is still the exhibitor's responsibility to have their original, official jump height card or temporary jump height form at each trial to present upon request. Additionally, if a measurement is necessary it is the exhibitors' responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running. Regulations for Agility Trials, Chapter 2, Section 4.

VMO MEASURING

Lori Sage is a VMO, so dogs under the age of 2 without a temporary measurement, and dogs that are age 2 or over without a height card or two official measurements MUST be measured before running.

NEW CLASSES—Premier Standard and Jumpers with Weaves

We are offering the newest AKC Agility titling class, Premier. This class will provide an opportunity for agility competitors to demonstrate different handling skills than those required for the Master Level Classes in Standard and Jumpers with Weaves. The Premier class will focus on handling the sequence or sequences of the day.

Both Standard and Jumpers with Weaves Premier courses will be Master level courses incorporating a number of elements that challenge the dog and handler in ways that are not seen on traditional AKC courses. These elements include sequences like treadles, back-side jumps, pull-through, layering, challenging weave pole entries, and longer running passes. One bi-directional jump or tunnel will be allowed to encourage handling strategies. Obstacle spacing on premier courses may exceed the limits of those on Master courses.

Eligibility. Dogs with an AX title are eligible to enter Premier Standard Regular. Dogs with an AX or AXP title are eligible to enter Premier Standard Preferred. Dogs with an AXJ title are eligible to enter Premier Jumpers with Weaves Regular. Dogs with an AXJ or AJP title are eligible to enter Premier Jumpers with Weaves Preferred.

MOVE UP AND CLASS CHANGE

Dogs may be moved up to a higher class at the request of the handler, as a result of completing an agility title at an earlier event, provided that the request is made to the Trial Secretary, in writing (e-mail is acceptable), by 6:00 PM on Monday, August 31, 2016. If a dog finishes a title during the trial, the handler may move up for the following days by filling out a move-up form (available at the event) and turning it in to the Trial Secretary within 30 minutes of the end of judging for the day.

The Regulations now allow exhibitors who have entered an incorrect class to change their entry to the class for which their dog is eligible, but the request for such a change must be in writing and must be submitted to the Trial Secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the Trial.

JUDGING

Judging starts 8:00 AM on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Judge's briefing and course walk-through will take place prior to that time, as specified in entry confirmation.

On <u>Friday and Sunday</u>, jump height divisions will run <u>Small to Tall</u>. On <u>Saturday</u>, they will run <u>Tall to Small</u>. Classes will alternate between the two rings (Standard and JWW). The order of class levels will be: Premier JWW, Excellent/Master, Open, and Novice, T2B will be the last class each day.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

EQUIPMENT

Obstacles used will meet the specifications given in the current AKC regulations. Contact obstacles have rubberized surfaces. Electronic timers will be used.

Equipment is provided by Lori Sage and K9 Sports. LLC.

REFRESHMENTS

No food concessions are available on the site. Please be aware that the closest town is at least 10 minutes from the show site. A catered lunch will be provided for trial volunteers, or by donation. Breakfast will be also be available all 3 days for donation.

Light snacks, coffee and water will be available as a courtesy for exhibitors. **PLEASE NOTE: CBDTC purchases all the food for this trial and it is prepared by Bev Johnson who works for tips. Please be generous so that she will continue to cook for us.** Breakfast and lunch is provided for workers; others may partake if there is food left after workers have been fed. Donations are strongly encouraged.

RINGSIDE

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through public address system, stewards, or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

VENFOR INFORMATION

Vendors, including photographers, are welcome at our trials. Please contact the Trial Chair at riggler@ymail.com *We are pleased to announce that Tripod Visions will be videoing all runs/classes for the weekend*.

AWARDS

Ribbons will be awarded to 1st through 4th place in each height division in each Regular and each Preferred class. Green ribbons will be awarded to all dogs receiving qualifying scores. New Title rosettes will be available for those completing a new title. Certificates will be awarded for High in Class on Friday and Saturday evening. A stadium cup will be provided to each person who enters this trial. Prizes can be picked up at the Secretary's tent.

A Rosette and jump bar will be awarded to any dog completing a MACH, PACH or PAX at all of these trials. A qualifying score is required for all awards. All awards must be claimed at the show; none will be mailed.

*** If you think that you may complete a MACH, PACH or PAX at these trials, please let the trial secretary know ahead of time, so that we can plan to celebrate with you! ***

VOLUNTEERS

Will receive lunch on us! In order to make this a successful trial, we will need your time and expertise to help with various tasks. We will have a white board for worker sign-ups at the trial each day. We appreciate our volunteers and lunch will be provided each day. You need not have experience to volunteer, we will train you.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

The rings will be fenced with temporary fencing and have entry and exit openings. Crating space will be available around the rings; however, there is limited shade, so please plan accordingly. There is no inside crating space available. On Thursday the grounds will be available for set up beginning at 6:00 p.m.- or AFTER the rings have been set. Please DO NOT set your crating, e-z ups, mats etc. prior to the equipment being moved in and the rings set up. We would appreciate any help with setting up and volunteers will have the first opportunity to set up.

POTLUCK

As has been our tradition for several years, CBDTC will be hosting evening events with our Judge at the trial site and <u>everyone</u> is welcome & encouraged to attend. Friday we will provide pulled pork sliders. Saturday we will prepare our traditional "Cream Can" Supper. We also ask that you provide a dish to share each evening. (appetizer, salad, side, or dessert.) There will be more information forthcoming as we near the trial dates. Handlers may opt to enter in a higher height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes must compete at the required jump height and may not compete in a jump height division **higher or lower** than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an Agility Jump Height Card may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.
