ENTRY FEES

First entry is \$19 for the first run then \$15 for the second, then \$13 for all additional runs per dog/per day, Juniors pay \$12 per run. Please make checks payable to CBDTC (Columbia Basin Dog Training Club). Entry fees include AKC recording fee of \$3.50 first entry and \$3.00 additional Entry. Catalogs may be pre-ordered for \$15 on the entry form.

ONLINE ENTRIES

Online entries are available for these trials through the online entry service provided by R2Agility. Go to www.r2agilityonline.com to set up an account and follow instructions there. During the first 48 hours after opening the initial limit of entries per day designated as either online or paper will be as follows: For each trial, 100 runs/trial via online entries, 230 runs/trial via paper entries. If either form of entry has not filled at the end of the 48 hour time period, the Club reserves the right to decrease or increase either one accordingly.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months or age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Services (FSS) breeds. Bitches in season are not allowed on the show grounds.

Important Information for Exhibitors-- PLEASE READ!

Conditional, unsigned, incomplete, illegible, telephone, fax, e-mail or telegraph entries cannot be accepted. Entries not on official AKC forms, or photocopies of AKC forms without the agreement and rules on the reverse side of the official AKC entry form, are not acceptable. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. Contact the Trial Secretary if you have any questions.

A complete set of rules for all classes is available from the American Kennel Club, 8051 Arco Corporate Drive, Suite 100, Raleigh, NC 27617-3390, or from the AKC web site. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to enter their dog in the correct class. The Trial Secretary cannot make any changes (except for move-ups as a result of completing a title, and correction of specific errors as provided in the Regulations for Agility Trials, Chapter 1, Section 21) after the closing date of the trial. Be sure to check your entry form carefully and make certain you have entered the correct class(es). Please contact the Trial Secretary if you have any questions.

Entries sent by express mailing services MUST have the delivery signature requirement waived; otherwise receipt may be delayed. Entries will not be considered as being received until they are delivered to the address given on the entry form. Please note the opening date of July 20, 2021; no entries will be accepted before that date. Entries for a maximum of ten (10) dogs are allowed in one envelope; envelopes containing entries for more than ten dogs will be considered invalid, and will be returned to the sender.

WAIT LIST

CBDTC is using a wait list to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date/time. A maximum of 25 entries (runs) will be placed on each trial's wait list. All entries must have been received by the Trial Secretary prior to Friday, September 1, 2021 at 8:00 p.m. Any entries withdrawn, with notification to the Trial Secretary in writing (e-mail OK) by 8:00 a.m. on Monday, September 6, 2021 will be replaced by a wait listed entry, if any are available. If a withdrawn entry is replaced by a wait listed entry, a full refund will be issued for the withdrawn entry; otherwise no refund will be given for withdrawn entries, except as specified above. Any wait listed entry that does not get into the trial will receive a full refund.

REFUNDS

Entry fees will not be refunded in the event of errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date, or in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by the Show Committee. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

Bitches in season are not permitted to compete in agility trials. As such, the club will refund the full amount if the trial secretary has confirmed receipt of information on or before the close of the trial. After closing, refunds less \$3.50 in fees per class/per day will be given for bitches in season, if written email notification is received by the TRIAL SECRETARY prior to the start of the trial. Verification from a veterinarian may be required at the clubs discretions.

CONFIRMATION AND JUDGING SCHEDULE

Confirmation of entry and judging schedule will be e-mailed (or sent by postal mail to the address on the official AKC entry form, if no e-mail is provided) after the closing date; if not received at least 3 days prior to the show, contact the Trial Secretary. Acknowledgment of receipt of entries prior to closing will be provided if the exhibitor provides a valid e-mail address on the entry form, or includes a stamped, self-addressed postcard with entry.

LIABILITY

Club members will be present at the trial site overnight. However, Columbia Basin Dog Training Club assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or spectators or to any of their dogs or property, and further assumes no responsibility for injury to any child not under the control of his/her parents or guardians. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Show Committee, be asked to leave the show site and no refund of any fees paid will be made. All dogs must be on leash at all times except when in the ring or designated warm-up area.

THIS CLUB DOES NOT AGREE TO ARBITRATE CLAIMS AS SET FORTH ON THE OFFICIAL AKC ENTRY FORM FOR THIS EVENT.

CLASS AND HEIGHT DIVISIONS

It is the exhibitor's responsibility to enter the dog in the correct class. The Trial Secretary cannot make any changes (except for move-ups as noted) after the closing date of the trial. Be sure to check your entry form and confirmation letter carefully and make certain you have entered the correct classes.

In the Regular classes, handlers may choose to run in a higher height division, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. In the Preferred classes, dogs may NOT run in a higher height division than that determined by their withers height.

The entry form has a box at the top of the form to check if the dog needs to be measured. Please check this box if appropriate, so that the Trial Secretary knows to include your dog on the "Dogs to be Measured List". It is no longer required that you submit a copy of your dogs jump height card with your entry form or show it during day of show check-in, but it is still the exhibitor's responsibility to have their original, official jump height card or temporary jump height form at each trial to present upon request. Additionally, if a measurement is necessary it is the exhibitors' responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running. Regulations for Agility Trials, Chapter 2, Section 4.

VMO MEASURING

Lori Sage is a VMO, so dogs under the age of 2 without a temporary measurement, and dogs that are age 2 or over without a height card or two official measurements MUST be measured before running. Lori is entered in this trial and is doing VMO work as a favor to our club. Please do not wait until the last minute to get your dog measured. Thank you!

MOVE UP AND CLASS CHANGE

Dogs may be moved up to a higher class at the request of the handler, as a result of completing an agility title at an earlier event, provided that the request is made to the Trial Secretary, in writing (e-mail is acceptable), by 6:00 PM on Monday, September 6, 2021. If a dog finishes a title during the trial, the handler may move up for the following days by filling out a move-up form (available at the event) and turning it in to the Trial Secretary within 30 minutes of the end of judging for the day.

The Regulations now allow exhibitors who have entered an incorrect class to change their entry to the class for which their dog is eligible, but the request for such a change must be in writing and must be submitted to the Trial Secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the Trial.

JUDGING

Judging starts at 8:00 AM on all days. Judge's briefing and course walk-through will take place prior to that time, as specified in entry confirmation.

On Friday and Sunday, jump height divisions will run Tall to Small. On Saturday, they will run Small to Tall. Classes will alternate between the two rings (Standard and JWW).

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds. Please be courteous as we don't want to lose this wonderful location.

EQUIPMENT

Obstacles used will meet the specifications given in the current AKC regulations. Contact obstacles have rubberized surfaces. Electronic timers will be used.

Equipment is provided by Lori Sage and K9 Sports. LLC.

REFRESHMENTS

No food concessions are available on the site. Please be aware that the closest town is at least 10 minutes from the show site. A catered lunch will be provided for trial volunteers ONLY. Volunteers that work for two or more classes each day will receive lunch.

RINGSIDE

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through public address system, stewards, or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

VENDOR INFORMATION

Vendors, including photographers, are welcome at our trials. Please contact the Trial Chair at riggler@ymail.com.

VOLUNTEERS

Will receive lunch on us! To make this a successful trial, we will need your time and expertise to help with various tasks. We will have a white board for worker sign ups at the trial each day. We appreciate you and lunch will be provided each day for workers that volunteer to work AT LEAST 2 classes. You need not have experience to volunteer, we will train you. There will be a worker raffle each day for those volunteers. Certificates for future entry fees will be provided for the raffle. Please volunteer often to move the trial as quickly as possible.

AWARDS

Ribbons will be awarded to 1st through 4th place in each height division in each Regular and each Preferred class. Green ribbons will be awarded to all dogs receiving qualifying scores. New Title rosettes will be available for those completing a new title. Certificates will be awarded for High in Class on Friday and Saturday evening. Sunday certificates will be available at the awards table.

A Rosette and jump bar will be awarded to any dog completing a MACH, PACH or PAX at all of these trials. A qualifying score is required for all awards. All awards must be claimed at the show; none will be mailed.

***** If you think that you may complete a MACH, PACH or PAX at these trials, please let the trial secretary know ahead of time, so that we can plan to celebrate with you! *****

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

The rings will be fenced with temporary fencing and have entry and exit openings. Crating space will be available around the rings; however, there is limited shade, so please plan accordingly. There is no inside crating space available. On Thursday the grounds will be available for set up beginning at 6:00 p.m. **or AFTER** the rings have been set. **Please DO NOT set your crating, e-z ups, mats etc. prior to the equipment being moved in and the rings set up.** We would appreciate any help with setting up and **volunteers will have the first opportunity to set up. Club President/Trial Chair will give the OK when you can begin setting up!** If you notice others appear to be setting up, please wait for the all clear as space for vendors will be reserved. ***If you set up earlier than authorized, you will be asked to remove your set up.***

- Merge onto I-82E Exit 110 toward YAKIMA
- Take the WA-225 N Exit, Exit 96, toward WEST RICHLAND/BENTON CITY
- Turn LEFT onto WA-225, at stop sign go STRAIGHT on WA-225, crossing the river.

Most Recent Rule Changes:

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors are allowed to enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. For example, the same dog may now be entered in Regular FAST and/or T2B to finish up those titles while also entered in Preferred Master STD/JWW to start working towards their PACH at the lower height. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed.

Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each

When calculating entry fees, treat multiple entry forms for the same dog as if only one form had been filled out. In other words, the 1st run entry fee is only paid once per day, per dog, even if that dog's runs have been submitted on multiple entry forms.

Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO) - T2B & FAST classes only.

For Exhibition Only may be offered at the option of the host club. FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO will be of value to new exhibitors or exhibitors that are having difficulty with a specific obstacle and/or ring environment. Competitors must enter in T2B and/or FAST. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) (T2B and/or FAST) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master). If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).
- Toys are allowed in the ring
 - Toys must be non-audible
 - Toys may not leave the handler's hand
 - Toys that roll freely cannot be used
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring
- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and /or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time.

Fix and Go On (FNG)

Fix and Go On, (FNG) allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers may opt to enter in a higher height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes must compete at the required jump height and may not compete in a jump height division higher or lower than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an Agility Jump Height Card may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the AKC Canine PartnersSM program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler number on the left of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner?
