The exhibitor is fully responsible for entering the dog in the correct class(es)/height divisions. Dogs running in a lower height division than they are eligible for will be eliminated.

MEASURING and HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION

Generally, all dogs competing in agility must possess an official AKC Jump Height Card. Dogs without a permanent Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured by a **Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO)** or an **Agility Field Rep** if present. The exception to this requirement is a dog entered in the 24" or 26" height division. **Our judge is not a VMO.**

When filling out the entry form, there is a section at the top of the form for exhibitors to designate whether your dog needs to be officially measured. Please check the box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the *Dogs To Be Measured List*.

DOG ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes

No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance. **Illegible entries** will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor.

ONLINE ENTRIES: This trial does accept online entries through R2Agility (<https://r2agilityonline.com>). During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries will be designated as follows: Online entries 120; Paper entries 230. If either form of entry has not filled at the end of the 48 hour time period, the club reserves the right to decrease or increase either the online or paper limits accordingly. No hand deliveries will be accepted in the first twenty-four hours following the opening date and time.

CATALOGS

Advance catalog sales may be ordered and prepaid on your entry form for \$10. A limited number of catalogs will be available for sale at the trial site for a cost of \$15.

All dogs must be on leash at all times when on trial site during trial hours except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.

MOVE-UPS

Move-ups as a result of titles earned after entries close must be submitted in writing or email so that Heather (Trial Secretary) receives them by **6:00 PM PDT on Monday, April 7, 2025**. Include dog's call name, owner's name, class you are moving from, and class you are moving to (replying to your final CONFIRMATION EMAIL is an ideal way to complete a move-up). If you do not receive an acknowledgement of your move-up request within 24 hours of sending, please contact Heather to make sure that it was received. No phone move ups accepted. Day-to-day move-ups will be accepted at the trial.

Move-ups for Saturday and Sunday must be submitted in writing no later than 30 minutes after the conclusion of the last class on Friday and/or Saturday. All Novice A entries must be moved to Novice B as soon any title has been earned. For allowed changes from Novice A to Novice B, refer to Chapter 1, Section 21 of the Regulations for Agility Trials.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

REFUNDS

100% of entry fees will be refunded for any reason if written (or email) request is received by the trial secretary on or before closing.

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee.

Bitches in season are not permitted to compete in Agility Trials. As such, the club will refund all entry fees for bitches unable to compete for this reason. Notification must be received by the Secretary prior to the start of judging on the first day of the trial or cluster of trials.

Sick or injured dogs, sick or injured handlers will receive a refund of entry fees less \$5.00 per run/day if written (e-mail) notification is received by the Trial Secretary 30 minutes prior to the start of the trial.

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely. Keep track of your dog. Don't allow them to lunge at other dogs or other dogs in crates. Be considerate of the confined spaces.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Spokane Agility Club, the Trial Secretary and Spokane County Fair and Expo and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The Spokane Agility Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Spokane Agility Club or any official thereof.

RINGSIDE

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging if the dog has a valid temporary or permanent jump height card.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

This club does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.

CLASS CHANGES EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2021

ENTERING A MIXTURE OF REGULAR AND PREFERRED CLASSES WITHIN THE SAME TRIAL WEEKEND – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

ENTERING FOR EXHIBITION ONLY (FEO)

FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.

- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.

- Dogs may be entered in any level. If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.

- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).

FIX AND GO ON (FNG)

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

COVID OR OTHER COMMUNICATIVE DISEASES

SAC will follow the state and federal medical requirements in place at the time of the trial. By signing the entry form you agree to abide by the requirements. Exhibitors agree to hold the host club, Spokane County Fair and Expo Center and the AKC harmless in respect to these rules. Exhibitors entering these trials do so at their own risk.

COURSE WALK-THROUGHS AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Course maps will be posted, emailed and available online after 12 AM the day before each trial. Maps will not be printed

Judge's briefing will occur prior to each class except for Excellent/Masters. Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only. Injured handlers may walk with their substitute handler. Handlers with multiple dogs, at events with multiple rings may request to walk with a height group other than the one their dog is entered in if a conflict is imminent.

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, may be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog. Use is limited to 3 minutes per dog/handler combination.

RIBBONS, AWARDS, AND PRIZES

Ribbons will be awarded in each jump height division in each class as follows:

First Place.....	Blue
Second Place.....	Red
Third Place.....	Yellow
Fourth Place.....	White
Qualifying Score.....	Dark Green

A New Title rosette will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title. A MACH/PACH rosette and decorated MACH/PACH bar will be awarded to all dog and handler teams that attain their MACH/PACH. PAX Title Rosettes will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing their PAX title. If you are close to earning an award, please let the [Trial Chair or Trial Secretary](#) know so that the club is prepared to celebrate with you.

Qualifying stickers will be placed in holders and posted by handler last name.

OBSTACLES AND RING CONDITIONS

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility Trials. All classes will take place indoors on a packed dirt surface. Ring size will be 95X110.

This Trial is held at the Spokane County Fair & Expo Center which hosts a variety of events. A car show is scheduled to be on the grounds the same weekend as this Trial. This could change or additional events could be added. DIRECTIONS TO THE TRIAL SITE

DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO SPOKANE COUNTY FAIR AND EXPO CENTER, 404 N Havana, Spokane, WA 99202:

Coming from the west (Seattle/Spokane), take I-90 to the Freya exit (#283B) which merges with 3rd Avenue. Continue on 3rd to Havana St. Turn LEFT on Havana, and go 0.7 mile, crossing Sprague Avenue (traffic light) and continuing past the main Fairgrounds entrance to Broadway. Turn RIGHT on Broadway, go 0.5 mile and turn RIGHT into the Fairgrounds at Gate R.

Coming from the east (Idaho/Montana), take I-90 to the Broadway exit (#286) and turn RIGHT off the exit ramp onto Broadway. Continue for 1.0 mile on Broadway, crossing Fancher (traffic light), and then turn LEFT into the Fairgrounds at Gate R.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

SITE and BUILDING HOURS: Exhibitors can set up in the arena starting at 4:30 PM Thursday. The arena will be set up at 4:00 PM. If the arena layout is done earlier, the club will allow exhibitors to set up at an earlier time. The arena will be open to exhibitors at 7:00 AM Friday, Saturday and Sunday. The Trial Committee reserves the right to consolidate or move setups if necessary, to ensure crating space is available for all and access to the ring and practice jump is maintained.

Overnight RV Parking

Reserved overnight parking is available at the Fairgrounds under the following conditions:

1. RV parking will be available to the northeast of the arena building bordered by Broadway, under the dirt covered arena and around the stall area. There will be 110 power available at these sites but a UL approved and labeled extension cord will be needed. There will be limited parking on the north side of the grandstand with 110 power. See map. RV parking is available in the dirt near the dump site and in the fairgrounds campground. These sites will have 30/50 amp electrical hookups.
2. No water hookups are available but there is a frost-free faucet for fill up.
3. Fees for camping \$47.
4. All generators must be shut off and dogs kept quiet after 10:00 pm. Exhaust vents are required. This maybe revised depending on the weather.
5. All overnight parking units must be self-contained. No dumping of gray water or sewage. All units must have a fire extinguisher on board.
6. All parking spaces must be left clean with all trash properly disposed of in the dumpsters.
7. No overnight parking in Day Parking areas.

Additionally, I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify, defend and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties for damage because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this event, however such, injuries, death or property damage may be caused, and whether or not the same may have been caused or may be alleged to have been caused by the negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees, agents, or any other person. INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher or 24-choice height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes **must** compete at the required jump height and **may not** compete in a jump height division **higher or lower** than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an Agility Jump Height Card may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the AKC Canine PartnersSM program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.
