This trial accepts both online and mail in entries.

No entry shall be made, and no entry shall be accepted, which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance. Please write your email address legibly. Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor.

Online Entries

Online entries are available for these trials through R2 Agility, www.r2agilityonline.com. During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries per day designed as either online or paper will be 100 runs/trial via online entries, 250 runs/trial via paper entries. If either form of entry has not filled at the end of the 48-hour period, the club reserves the right to decrease or increase either one accordingly. The club does not maintain a wait list for online entries.

Dogs Eligible to Enter

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC limited registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or AKC Canine partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds. Bitches in season, aggressive dogs, blind dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance are ineligible to participate. Mixed breed dogs that have been listed with AKC Canine Partners are eligible to participate, provided that their listing number has been recorded on the entry form. Please designate the dog's breed as "All American Dog" on the entry form.

Awards

Ribbons will be awarded for Qualifying scores and for first through fourth place in each height division. Ribbons: First Place: Blue, Second Place: Red, Third Place: Yellow, Fourth Place: White, Qualifying Score: Dark Green. New title rosette will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title. Double Q ribbons will be awarded for those who earn a Masters JWW and a Masters STD on the same day. A qualifying score is required for all awards. All awards must be claimed at the show. A MACH / PAX / PACH Ribbon and Jump Bar will be given for any new MACH / PAX / PACH dog! **Please let the trial secretary know before the trial if you are close.**

Important Information for Exhibitors -- PLEASE READ!

Conditional, unsigned, incomplete, illegible, telephone, fax, or e-mail entries cannot be accepted. Entries not on official AKC forms, or photocopies of AKC forms without the agreement and rules on the reverse side of the official AKC entry form, are not acceptable. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry.

Owners are responsible for errors on entry forms, for entering the same dog twice, or for entering a dog in a class for which it is not eligible, regardless of who makes such errors. Dogs wrongly entered in a class may not be transferred to another class after closing, EXCEPT as provided for in the Regulations for Agility Trials, Chapter 1, Section 21. Be sure to check your entry form carefully and make certain you have entered the correct class(es). Contact the Trial Secretary if you have questions.

Entries sent by express mailing services MUST have the delivery signature requirement waived, otherwise receipt may be delayed. Entries will not be considered as being received until they are delivered to the address given on the entry form. Please note the opening date of August 1st, 2026; no entries will be accepted before that date. Entries for a maximum of ten (10) dogs are allowed in one envelope; envelopes containing entries for more than ten dogs will be considered invalid and will be returned to the sender. No hand delivered entries can be accepted after 6:00 PM of October 1, 2026.

Entry fees will not be refunded in the event of errors or cancelation of entries after the published closing date, or in the event a dog is absent (other than as specified on page 2), disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by the Show Committee. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

THIS CLUB DOES NOT AGREE TO ARBITRATE CLAIMS AS SET FORTH ON THE OFFICIAL AKC ENTRY FORM FOR THIS EVENT.

Confirmation of entry and judging schedule will be e-mailed (or sent by postal mail to the address on the official AKC entry form, if no e-mail is provided) after the closing date; if not received at least 7 days prior to the show, contact the Trial Secretary. Acknowledgment of receipt of entries prior to closing will be provided if the exhibitor provides a valid e-mail address on the entry form, or includes a stamped, self-addressed postcard with entry.

Wenatchee Confluence Park, Wenatchee Kennel Club, and trial secretary assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or spectators, or to any of their dogs or property, and further assumes no responsibility for injury to any child not under the control of his or her parents or guardians. It is

expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Show Committee, be asked to leave the show site and no refund of any fees paid will be made.

Dog safety is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

Entering Regular & Preferred Jump Heights

Exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. For example, the same dog may now be entered in Regular FAST and/or T2B to finish up those titles while also entered in Preferred Master STD/JWW to start working towards their PACH at the lower height. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires Standard Agility and Jumpers with Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights [in different classes] within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day. A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred classes and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend, thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend. [EXAMPLE: if you are entering a dog in some Regular classes and some Preferred classes, submit one entry form for the Regular classes, and another entry form for the Preferred classes.] When calculating entry fees, treat multiple entry forms for the same dog as if only one form had been filled out. In other words, the 1st run entry fee is only paid once per day, per dog, even if that dog's runs have been submitted on multiple entry forms.

Move-Ups

Move-ups after entries close must be submitted to the Trial Secretary by 6:00 PM PDT on Monday, Oct. 5th, 2026. Include dog's call name, registration number, owner's name, class you are moving from, and class you are moving to. Send via mail, or email to Laurie Clark (ljclark@comcast.net). No phone move-ups accepted. Day-to-day move-ups will be accepted at the trial. Move-ups must be submitted in writing no later than 30 minutes after the trial ends.

The regulations now allow exhibitors who have entered a class for which they or their dog is not eligible, to change their entry to a class for which they are eligible. The request for such a change must be in writing and must be submitted to the Trial Secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the trial. THIS DOES NOT MEAN THAT MOVEUPS CAN BE DONE AT THE LAST MINUTE! It does mean that if you have previously moved up and then learn your dog has not met the requirements for moving up, you may move back to the correct class, or if you entered Novice A and dog or handler is not eligible, you may move to Novice B. If you have questions. DON'T GUESS – PLEASE ASK.

Fix and Go On (FNG)

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather it occurs during the run. FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of one obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

For Exhibition Only (FEO)

At the option of the club, a handler may choose to change any class entry into a For Exhibition Only (FEO) run. The handler must notify the scribe and the judge as they enter the ring prior to the start of the run that they are doing an FEO run. The scribe sheet shall be marked "FEO", no time "NT", and "E" for an excused, non-qualifying run. Maximum Courses Time for FEO shall be 45 seconds for all classes, except for FAST which will use the FAST course times.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form: the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level- Novice, Open, Excellent, Master. If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out to the scribe and the judge.
- Toys are allowed in the ring.
 - > Toys must be non-audible
 - > Toys may not leave the handler's hand
 - > Toys that roll freely cannot be used.

- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring.
- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as punitive correction. Harsh verbal and/or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time.

REFUNDS

A refund of entry fees will be given for any bitch that comes into season after the close of entries, provided that the trial secretary is notified before the commencement of judging each day. Except for the above, there shall be no refunds for entries withdrawn after the closing date or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for such dismissal. Bitches in season are not allowed in the Agility Trial area.

CLASSES OFFERED

All levels of Standard, Jumpers with Weaves, (Fri, Sat, Sun) FAST (Sat, Sun), T2B (Fri, Sat, Sun) and Premier Standard & Premier JWW (Sat). Standard and Preferred Classes will be offered for all levels. A complete set of rules for all classes is available from the American Kennel Club, 8051 Arco Corporate Drive, Raleigh, NC, 27617, or from the AKC web site. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to enter their dog in the correct class. The Trial Secretary cannot make any changes (except for move-ups as noted) after the closing date of the trial. Be sure to check your entry form carefully and make certain you have entered the correct class(es).

Please volunteer to work – even if you are only available to work for one height in a class, that will help the trials run more smoothly! We recognize that it is hard to schedule workers when there are two rings running – do your best to both volunteer and give your dogs a good time.

Judging Schedule

Judging will begin no earlier than 9:00 AM each day Judge's briefing and course walk-through will take place 15 minutes prior to listed start times. The Tentative judging schedule is listed below; any changes will be specified in the final schedule that will be sent at the time of final confirmation. Run order will be Small to Tall on Friday and Sunday, Tall to Small on Saturday.

Measuring and Jump Height Card Information

Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may choose to enter in a higher or 24-choice height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes must compete at the required jump height and may not compete in a jump height division higher or lower than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an Agility Jump Height Card may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

On the entry form, please designate whether your dog has a valid jump height card or if your dog needs to be measured. Please check the appropriate box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the Dogs to Measured List. It is no longer required that you submit a copy of your dog's jump height card with your entry form or show it during the day of show check-in. However, it is the sole responsibility of the exhibitor to have their original, official jump height card or temporary jump height form at each trial to present upon request. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running. Regulations for Agility Trials, Chapter 2, Section 4.

Dogs under 2 years of age with an official temporary measurement, dogs with a permanent height card, and dogs that have had at least one official measurement.

There is a section at top of the entry form to designate if your dog has a valid height card or if it needs to be measured. Please arrive early at the trial if your dog(s) needs to be measured. Our Judges are not Voluntary Measurement Officials. ALL dogs competing in agility must possess an official AKC Jump Height Card, permanent or temporary. See Chapter 2, Section 5 of the Regulations for Agility Trials Handbook for rules.

From East Hwy 97 and 2: Take the US-97 Alt N exit toward Entiat/Chelan (follow State Park Signs). Turn left onto Euclid Ave. Turn left to stay on Euclid. Turn right onto Isenhart Ave. Turn right onto Olds Station Rd and to the State Park signs and entrance.

Parking, Camping, and Lodging

PARKING: A Discover Pass is required to park at Confluence State Park. Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher or 24-choice height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes **must** compete at the required jump height and **may not** compete in a jump height division **higher or lower** than their proper height division. All dogs that have not been officially measured for an Agility Jump Height Card may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial *or back-to-back trials* only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running. Dogs listed in the AKC Canine PartnersSM program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box. **Junior Handlers** should enter their Junior Handler number on the front of this form.
